## Let's begin the music!

(IMPORTANT NOTE: If your School is licensed by PPL and PRS to play music on your school radio station, then you can also include music in all program elements)

- 1. Create a Music Radio Programme! But first, choose a focus point. A great start would involve research:
  - ◆ Are there any groups/individuals who would like to perform live during a radio programme? Alternatively they could record their performance prior to the programme, ensuring a few opportunities to practise and edit out any little bits ..
  - ◆ Are there are subject topics that are being covered?
    Perhaps a specific composer or musical period?
  - ◆ Peter and the Wolf by Prokofiev (a Russian composer), is a fantastic way to introduce classical music and to help appreciate the importance and differences between instruments.
- 2. Create a Programme Schedule. We must detail times and all notes that are vital to the performance! If it's live, every second counts so make sure you have practised the schedule before the live programme begins.
- 3. Organise the schedule into groups and create a team. This is essential in ensuring a smooth performance. You will need:
  - ◆ A few presenters (create a script that creates a fair share of air time, otherwise the most confident person may speak throughout the entire programme).
